SMITH COVE PARK DEVELOPMENT PROJECT UPDATE

Seattle Parks and Recreation is beginning the next phase of the design process for Smith Cove Park. A component of moving the design forward from our last public meeting held in Feb. 2017 has been to refine the project budget. To that end, we are proposing to phase the project to maximize investment opportunities.

Please join Seattle Parks and Recreation staff and Gustafson Guthrie Nichol (GGN) on December 5. At this meeting, we will outline our phasing strategy and schedule for the park development. This is an opportunity to learn about the project, receive design updates and ask us any questions you may have about the project. The community is encouraged to attend.

Smith Cove Park is located just west of Pier 91 at the foot of Magnolia Hill on Elliott Bay. This project will develop the 4.9 acre easterly waterfront portion of Smith Cove Park acquired from King County and makes improvements to the playfield half of Smith Cove Park (west of 23rd Ave. W) used for youth sports such as soccer. The improved park will provide opportunities for active and passive recreation for all ages and abilities, increase environmental-sensitivity, and make the park inviting and usable for more people.
