VICTOR STEINBRUECK PARK RENOVATION PPMHC Application for Certificate of Approval August 2, 2019



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INTRODUCTION

project description

The Victor Steinbrueck Park Improvements project is the result of the 2008 Parks and Green Spaces Levy. As described in the Levy language, the work will include improvements to public safety, including but not limited to improving sight lines into the park, renovating seating, renovating the former children's play area, and improving and expanding lighting.

Half of the park sits atop a Unico owned parking garage, and early in the design process, SPR and the design team determined that the waterproofing membrane beneath the park was failing, which is typical for projects of this age. Investigation by Tatley Grund Associates, and on-site analysis by Amento Group, the team's waterproofing consultant, documented water below the membrane at all pothole locations, along with efflorescence, staining, active leaks, rust, and spalling on the underside of the garage lid. Based on these findings and the recommendations of Amento Group (waterproofing) and Lund Opsahl (structural engineers), SPR made the decision to repair the waterproofing in order to protect the City's investment in the Levy authorized renovations. The waterproofing investigation and recommendations was documented fully in the presentation made to the PPMHC on 3/9/2016.

Waterproofing repair requires the complete removal of park features that sit over the garage, the installation of a new waterproofing system with a 30 year warranty, and reconstruction of the park. The grade of the park will be raised 4.5" - 5.5" along the guardrail. In order to maintain the relatively flat nature of the park, the grade change has the effect of requiring park reconstruction back to the sidewalk in most areas.

Improvements also include minor circulation updates at the park's edges changes in context. These include a connection to MarketFront (honoring Victor Steinbrueck's vision that the park be an extension of the Market), and a connection into the Tree of Life area for improved sight lines and access into this area.

Other improvements honor the significance of the park to Seattle's Native American communities, specifically the Urban Native community. These interpretive elements support the original design intent of the park as a place that welcomes all people, recognize Seattle's Native American communities and reflect the local Coast Salish culture.

The Seattle Department of Parks and



Recreation and the design team led a project design process with broad public and stakeholder outreach that included conversations with the following groups:

Jones and Jones provided questions that they felt were appropriate to ask each of these groups and communities. Responses are summarized in the Design Review Committee Presentation dated Sept. 7, 2016.

Park improvements are in keeping with the Park Place Market Historic Preservation District Guidelines. The improvements honor the original design intent of the park as an extension of the Market, and will help preserve the park's legacy and significance in a changing city. SPR is required to submit the project design to City Council for review and approval prior to appropriation of levy funds for construction.

- Wooden Bollards at Park Entries These bollards do not prevent vehicles from entering the park and are being removed because these have been deemed unnecessary.



TO BE ALTERED

- Benches. Benches will be installed in the same locations and design as existing, with the addition of Coast Salish patterned arm rests to provide ADA compliant seating in select locations.
- Concrete Walls at Lawn and Planting. Walls will be installed in same locations with added height and width to provide extra seating in the park.
- Special concrete paving with new Coast Salish basket-weave pattern at South Room. Special paving in the same location as existing brick paving, changed to cast in place concrete per SPR review of cost, durability, and ongoing maintenance of thin brick pavers (over waterproofing membrane on structure). Paving pattern added to honor the native community.
- Drinking Fountains. Same general locations, updated SPR standard model. locations, but with added height and width to provide extra seating space.
- Guardrail Type 1 (at north and south rooms). Modified to meet code requirements for rail height and structural loading. Includes new Rail Top with shelf to support original park functions (eating and taking in the view).
- Guardrail Type 2 (at Belvedere). Modified to meet code requirements for rail height and structural loading. Includes new rail top with Chief Sealth quote to support interpretive theme.
- Pavilion Seats. Proposed benches are in the same place as existing but are freestanding for ease of access to this area.
- Picnic Tables. Proposed design has metal legs for durability, is sized to allow for ADA seating spaces, and is provided in more varied sizing to support a broader range of group size and comfortable distances for conversation.

- Planting Areas. Planting areas are same as existing, with additional planting in original location near the Children's area. Plant species include blueberries and low evergreen species per original design. Additional new species reflect community desire for a more native plant palette.
- Pole Lights. Poles will be salvaged and re-furbished. Globe light fixtures similar in style to existing will be installed on top. New fixtures have new LED technology, integral caps and a fritted surface - they will reduce glare and provide more even lighting.
- Lawn Access Areas. Selected wall segments lowered (step height or flush) to provide easier access to lawns.
- Low Level Lighting. Concrete posts will be removed and light fixtures will be placed in walls. This improves accessibility around path edges, and durability of fixtures.
- Stools. Proposed design is similar to existing with adjustments for durability of installation, improved comfort, and ease of maintenance.

The following ALTERED items will be Additive Bid Items:

• Pavilion. The proposed design is almost identical to existing but is 2' longer for necessary structural connections to garage, includes 6" in additional clearance for improved views, has freestanding columns for improved circulation, new detailing for improved durability, and storm water gutters for comfort and maintenance. Coast Salish Column Wraps have been added to honor the native community. SPR plans to obtain additional funding for this element to ensure that it is constructed.

NEW FEATURES

- Children's Area (the original design included a Children's Area where the Tree of Life is today). Planting, Boulders, and Stone Paving Inlays. These features reflect the natural character of the original play area and are being added to replace lost features and respond to community desire for a children's area.
- Coast Salish Welcome Text at Walls. Added to honor the native community.
- Council Table. This table provides large group and family seating and is designed to be movable by SPR to support small programs and classes in the north room.
- Special concrete paving with Coast Salish basket-weave pattern at North Room. Added to compliment South Room paving, to reflect intent of original design for similar social rooms at both ends of the park (north and south). Pattern added to honor the native community.
- Connection to Tree of Life. Added to improve circulation into the north side of the park and encourage use of the Tree of Life Area.

Grove Trees (part of original design). Grove trees will be planted in same area as original design. New species with similar character and fall color were selected for urban tolerance.

- Modified South Wall and MarketFront Connection. Added to provide park users with a direct and accessible connection to MarketFront.
- Vines Over Driveway (part of original design). New species selected for urban tolerance.
- Stair to Western Avenue. Required to meet ADA guidelines (existing path is a non-compliant ramp).

 Waste Bins. Metal waste bins in simple and classic design replace existing plastic bins for improved bee and wasp control, aesthetic coordination with other park features, and durability.
