





SITE PLAN



1. GREEN STREET SCULPTURE GARDEN / VOLUNTARY SETBACK

DESCRIPTION

A deep setback is proposed at 9th Ave to create a publicly accessible urban park and to capitalize on the view corridor towards Denny Park to the north. The park is envisioned as an open and inviting public space with generous landscape areas and tree canopy highlighted by signature art pieces. Adjacent retail frontages and a residential entry help activate the park.

REQUIRED

- 2' green street setback (707 sf)
- Landscape provision: 1.5 x frontage length x 50% (250 sf)

PROPOSED BENEFIT

- Publicly accessible urban park (7,293 sf)
- Additional setback varying in width from 18'—30'
- Additional landscape area (1,782 sf)
- Additional trees (10 total)
- Additional seating (234 lf of seat wall)
- Signature art pieces (also refer to Public Benefit 3)
- Adjacent retail frontages
- Adjacent residential frontage. Two spaces have been reserved for seasonal private use.



2. GREEN STREET SCULPTURE GARDEN / ROW ENHANCEMENT

DESCRIPTION

Voluntary improvements to the street ROW's are proposed along 9th Ave (existing parking lane) and curb bulbs are planned at corner of the site. The improvements create wider sidewalks, provide more landscape opportunities and create safer and shorter pedestrian crossings at intersections.

REQUIRED

- None



- Increased sidewalk and landscape areas (4,126 sf)
- 2 curb bulb at 9th Ave & Howell St and 9th Ave & Stewart St
- Additional sidewalk area comprised of cut granite (5,306 sf)
- Seating opportunities within the ROW (338 sf)











3. PUBLICLY ACCESSIBLE ART

DESCRIPTION

Publicly accessible art is planned throughout the site. Signature art pieces are proposed at three locations within the 9th Ave park and another signature art piece focused on light is planned for the Through-Block Pedestrian Connection. Artist made building parts such as manhole covers, benches and paving are also planned throughout the site. The art will be selected by the owner and presented to the Public Art Advisory Committee.

REQUIRED

- None

PROPOSED BENEFIT

- Signature art pieces along the Green Street Sculpture Garden (3 total)
- Signature art piece using light at Through-Block Pedestrian Connection ceiling (1 total)
- Integrated art elements within ROW
 - 10+ decorative manhole covers
 - 8 street name paving inlay
 - 4 bike racks per frontage (16 total)
 - Custom benches (# TBD)



PRELIMINARY ARTWORK PLAN

CONCEPT STATEMENT

RC Hedreen envisions publicly accessible art in its development as key to creating a sense of place. Signature artworks are proposed within the 9th Ave Sculpture Garden and within the Through-Block Pedestrian Connection. In addition to the signature artwork, integrated artwork is also proposed within the ROW and publicly accessible areas of the project.

SIGNATURE ARTWORKS – 9TH AVE SCULPTURE GARDEN

- Three large sculptures by the prominent artist Beverly Pepper.
- The artworks are large scale and made of weathered steel.
- Each piece is strategically located along the sculpture garden.
 - “Broken Circle” will mark the Howell and 9th Ave intersection.
 - “Curved Presence”, the longer, more linear work will create a pausing point in the midst of the Garden.
 - “Curvae in Curvae” will be visible from both the sculpture garden as well as the new Through-Block Pedestrian Connection.

SIGNATURE ARTWORK – THROUGH-BLOCK PEDESTRIAN CONNECTION

- Developer to engage an artist or artist team for proposed signature artwork in the Through-Block Pedestrian Connection.
- The lighting art installation will be integrated into the through-block ceiling and ambient lighting system.
- The lighting art will be experienced at both day and night.
- The lighting art will be dynamic and programmable.
- The lighting art source will be dependent on the ultimate design concept but will be experienced from all parts of the Through-Block Pedestrian Connection.
- The lighting art will be experienced from outside the project to attract and invite the public into the Through-Block Pedestrian Connection.
- The lighting art medium will be dependent on the ultimate design concept but could be an LED or projection system.
- The lighting art concept will be reviewed, per SDC approved process, with the Public Arts Advisory Committee.

INTEGRATED ARTWORKS

- Integrated artwork and artist-made furnishings and building parts will be included throughout the project.
- Located within public right-of-ways and within publicly accessible private open spaces.
- Artwork may include, but are not limited to elements such as bike racks, seating, paving and manhole covers.
- Elements may be designed and produced by artists and / or design team members.

SCHEDULE FOR IMPLEMENTATION

Consistent with Section E.4.b. of the Downtown Amenity Standards, dated April 2011, prior to issuance of the building permit for the project, a final artwork plan will be reviewed with the Office of Arts and Cultural Affairs through its Public Arts Advisory Committee (PAAC). Meetings with the PAAC will include a briefing meeting to share the proposed art plan and follow-up meetings to share the selected art elements and/or artists. It is understood that issuance of the final Certificate of Occupancy for the project will be contingent, in part, on the completion and installation of the artwork associated with the block.



DESCRIPTION


Voluntary setbacks within the property line are proposed at Howell St, Stewart St and 8th Ave to increase sidewalk width and increase landscape area.

REQUIRED


- 3' easement required at Howell St and 8th Ave to achieve required 15' sidewalk width (1,850 sf)

PROPOSED BENEFIT

- Increased sidewalk and landscape areas (4,521 sf)
 - 2' voluntary setback on 8th Ave and Stewart St (1,149 sf)
 - 15' voluntary setback on Howell St (2,689 sf)
- 2 curb bulbs at 8th Ave & Stewart St and 8th Ave & Howell St






5. THROUGH-BLOCK PEDESTRIAN CONNECTION

DESCRIPTION


A covered, multi-modal and barrier free through-block passageway connecting 8th and 9th Ave is proposed through the project site. The Through-Block Pedestrian Connection is designed to be a pass-through space for the hotel function with the added capacity to accommodate a through block pedestrian connection.



PROPOSED BENEFIT

- Covered barrier free, 24 hour, secure environment for pedestrian access
- One covered bike share station (1 station with 20 bikes, also refer to Public Benefit 6)

6. BIKE SHARE PROGRAM

DESCRIPTION

A bike share station is planned for the site and will be coordinated with the cities developing bike share program. The station is planned within the Through-Block Pedestrian Connection to take advantage of the weather protection offered by the space and proximity to the public right of way.

REQUIRED

- None

PROPOSED BENEFIT

- Bike share station (1 total, 20 bikes, ticket kiosk and helmet vending machine)
- Under cover for year round weather protection.


