



Video / Audio Statement Guidelines & Resources

The City of Seattle does not endorse the following resources, but provides them as available options for those needing technical assistance.

General Guidelines

Applicants are invited to submit an audio or video statement instead of a written statement of interest if preferred. This should not be a highly produced/edited recording, a short recording that speaks directly to your interest in this project will suffice. The intent of this option is to provide an opportunity for individuals who feel they can represent themselves better verbally versus in writing (for example for applicants for whom English is a second language and/or other considerations).

Please Do:

- Focus your message on why you are interested in this project specifically.
- Limit background and/or ambient noise to ensure we can hear you clearly.
- If you are applying as a team, have all members of your artist team participate in some manner.
- Limit camera shake and movement.

Please Don't:

- Create a highly edited audio or video statement in which the visual messaging distracts from the verbal content.
- List accomplishments and/or experience without directly speaking to your interest in this specific project.
- Include other individuals speaking on your behalf.
- Include background music.
