**DISMISSAL ORDER**

The Executive Director of the City of Seattle Civil Service Commission hereby enters the following:

**BACKGROUND**

On March 16, 2015 Michael Spindler, (Appellant) filed an appeal with the Civil Service Commission regarding a one day suspension without pay.

The Commission assigned the appeal to CSC Hearing Officer, Chris Mathews and the hearing was conducted on May 4, 2015. Appellant represented himself and Chris Thomas, Employee Relations Manager, represented Seattle City Light.

On June 29, 2015, Chris Mathews, CSC Hearing Officer, issued the Findings, Conclusions and Decision in this matter determining Seattle City Light was justifiable in suspending Mr. Spindler for one day without pay.

At its July 15, 2015, monthly meeting Mr. Spindler was present to request the Commission waive the 10-day filing period for his Petition for Review that was not timely filed. The Commission took into consideration Mr. Spindler's request, and denied the request. The Commission also reviewed the Findings, Conclusions and Decision and unanimously affirmed the decision of the Hearing Officer.

**ORDER**

The Civil Service Commission hereby dismisses this appeal with *prejudice*.
