ORDINANCE NO. 85365

AN ORDINANCE relating to the widening of the existing viaduct and the approaches thereto in East 45th Street from 21st Avenue Northeast to Montlake Boulevard, amending Section 2 of Ordinance No. 84381 by providing additional funds from the City Street Fund therefor.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That Section 2 of Ordinance No. 84381, entitled:

"AN ORDINANCE providing for the widening of the existing viaduct and the approaches thereto in East 45th Street from 21st Avenue Northeast to Montlake Boulevard and appropriating money from the City Street Fund therefor,"

approved August 30, 1955, be and the same is hereby amended by increasing the appropriation from the City Street Fund therein from \$177,000 to \$202,000, as follows:

Section 2. That in order to effectuate the purpose described in Section 1 hereof the sum of Two Hundred Two Thousand Dollars (\$202,000.00) or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same is hereby appropriated from the City Street Fund of the City of Seattle and the City Comptroller is authorized and directed to draw, and the City Treasurer to pay, the necessary warrants therefor.

Section 2 This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.

Gentlemen:

We transmit herewith for your approval a council bill amending Ordinance No. 84381 by increasing the appropriation from the City Street Fund therein from \$177,000 to \$202,000.

Ordinance No. 84381 authorizes the widening of the East 45th Street Viaduct from 21st Avenue Northeast to Montlake Boulevard.

The low bid received for this project was 11.2% above the City Engineer's estimate. Examination of the bids leads us to the conclusion that we could not expect to better the bid by re-advertising.

The Board of Public Works wishes to award the contract as soon as possible in order to have the work completed before the buildup of student traffic when the University reopens in the fall.

In order to award the contract, the appropriation must be increased by \$25,000 to \$202,000.

We respectfully recommend that this council bill be approved.
