Painting Playground buildings (con't)

This project covers painting buildings over the entire Park System. The larger buildings being painted are Green Lake, and South Park Field Houses. West Green Lake, Madrona and Seward Bathhouses were painted before the bathing season opened.

Rafts for Bathing Beaches:

Two rafts for the bathing beaches at Fritchard Island and Golden Gardens were constructed in the bay at Seward Fark. Construction of these rafts was made possible by the contribution of cedar logs left over from the dredging of Green lake by the City Engineering Department.

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Cleveland Playground running track (con't)

As this track will be used by the Cleveland High School, they furnished all the material for the pit and about one-half for the running track.

This project is divided into three major units: An 18-hole golf course, an athletic field, and a recreation camp.

239 Golf Courses

The gelf course is 75% completed. At the present rate of progress it will be completely seeded by the middle of August. After the greens and fairways are completed the W.P.A. crew will start cleaning up the roughs or areas outside of the gelf course proper. They will start the improvements of roadways, walks, paths, etc.

There still remains pipe and tile to the amount of \$5,000.00 to be purchased to complete the water and drainage system. No funds are provided for this. Areas not piped are now reached by long lengths of hose. This is not a practical method of watering and it will probably have to be left dry when the city takes over the course.

No funds for clubhouse have been provided.

240 Athletic Field:

The football field has been seeded and the grass is growing very nicely. The field is completely watered and drained.

The running track is ready for cinders. These will be hauled from Marborview Hospital as soon as the Cleveland Playground track is completed.

The grandstand is nearly exapleted. The bleachers are 60% completed. The entire extructure and field will be ready for

play this fall. There will be seating capacity for 1500 under cover and 2600 in the iopen bleachers.

Ferking grounds and roadways for this joint use of the athletic field and golf course are graded and partly graveled.

Recreation Camps

Seven of the ten cabins are completed. The two rest rooms are well under way. Farade ground is graded and is now being fine-graded.

The Campfire Circle is almost completed. The brick masons are now working on a miniature mountain for hiking.

The purpose of this project is to provide camping facilities, sanitary provision, and room to carry out programs, but it is hoped that the various groups who use the camp will contribute different features such as signal towers, etc., to make the camp more interesting to those using it.

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There is, in Washington D.C., an application for a blanket W.P.A. project covering all parks and playgrounds amounting to \$235,428.20. If this project is approved separate units may be requested by the Fark Board and then approved by the W.P.A. State Office, Alaska Building, Seattle. This will save approximately one month's time in getting projects approved, as it would otherwise take about 2 weeks here for ap roval and approximately 6 weeks to 2 months in Washington, D.C.
