2. GENERAL SITUATION / STATUS:

a. Transportation Routes Closed or Restricted (air, land, waterways):

The general curfew order that had been imposed on Tuesday and Wednesday, from 7 PM till 7:30 AM, was not renewed for Thursday. At noon, approximately 3-5000 people with various affiliations joined together at The Labor Temple at 1st and Cedar to participate in an anti-WTO demonstration march. They peacefully followed a sanctioned route toward the downtown and Union St, where they reversed course for a return to the Denny Regrade area. The march fully cooperated with the police escort and lasted until about 4 PM. Today's WTO meetings were held without an interruption, although several NGO delegates possessing valid credentials were taken into custody for staging disorderly protests inside the Washington Trade and Convention Center. Adjournment of the WTO is expected later tonight.

Around 4:45 PM sporadic groups started gathering in various parts of downtown. They were blocking traffic with sit-downs and were calling for the release of detainees at the KC Jail and Regional Justice Center.

The limited curfew order, in effect since Tuesday and which expires at 2400 will be renewed until 7 AM tomorrow morning.

A review of arrest records indicates that some of those responsible for the vandalism on Tuesday were caught by police in the act committing wanton property destruction, and have been taken into custody.

<p>d. Other Damage or Losses (e.g. private property / agricultural losses):</p> <p>The Downtown Seattle Association is reporting estimates of 1.5-2 million dollars in property damage and 7 million dollars in lost business. This morning they sponsored a meeting with the business community, Chamber of Commerce, Capitol Hill Business Improvement Area, and City departments to spark a renewal of retail sales. So far they've enlisted close to 2,000 volunteers, who will start work tomorrow to aid in cleanup and re-establishing normalcy in the commercial sector. Insurance Commissioner Senn also had a meeting with various insurance industry representatives to determine how insurance companies would process claims. The initial response was promising, as it appears that most policies underwrite property damage incurred by civil unrest. They additionally indicated that riders covering business interruption experienced this week are common to most portfolios.</p>

The radios were actually provided by FEMA Rg 10 MERS. The last two of the six task forces staged under Fire Mob were withdrawn by noon. They have been phasing down since Wed. Current resource levels are judged to be sufficient for the foreseeable duration of the WTO</p>
