Dear Members of the City Council,

I have been a staunch advocate for social justice from New Jersey to Washington State. Across the Ohio Valley, I spoke publicly in support of increased access and funding for mental and behavioral health services to local and state legislatures. These opportunities contributed towards a scholarship to attend Seattle University in 2010.

Today, I continue my civic engagement as the Housing Chair within the Seattle Commission of People with disAbilities, and a member of the new Seattle Renters Commission. For most of the council, you've likely seen me advocating for these communities directly, most recently at the 25th ADA Anniversary Lunch and Learn on 7.23.15 as one of the first speakers of the program. I've also submitted two media coverage articles highlighting my work with this application. Additionally, I have worked as a social services professional in housing and homelessness services for the past five years, and have obtained my Masters of Nonprofit Leadership.

I realized within this past year that my passion leans more towards policy and legislative work than direct service. As I have told those closest to me, I will always love to help persons, but I am shifting my focus to serve people. I have begun a career shift into the government/legal sectors, starting with a transfer to the Masters of Public Administration program at Seattle University January 2018, and a possibility of enrollment into the J.D. program as a joint candidate January 2019.

I have fallen in love with this city; and through my work, I've had the honor of knowing hundreds, if not thousands of narratives that confirm the greatness that is Seattle. But there's much work to be done to ensure equity and justice for all Seattleites. Unfortunately, in the roles I've held, I've also empathized with folks whose narratives reveal gaps and systems failures where they've fallen through the cracks of the housing market, employment market, or justice system. But that's where the opportunity for excellence lies! Seattle has championed measures and established it's leadership as an American city that refuses to be nothing more than the forefront example of a safe, just, and accessible city for all who seek refuge here.

If selected for this position, I will serve Seattle as an advocate who seeks to empower the citizens of this great city by amplifying the voices of the multitudes who may be too close to the ground to be heard or seen. As an individual with both direct and professional experience navigating these systems, I seek appointment to the council to collaborate and strategize

on how these narratives can lead to measures that strengthen our infrastructure so there are no longer cracks through which members of our community can fall. Thank you for your consideration.
