

NOTICE OF A SEATTLE CITY COUNCIL PUBLIC HEARING ON LEGISLATION EXPANDING THE SENDING AREA OF THE TRANSFERABLE DEVELOPMENT RIGHTS PROGRAM

The Seattle City Council's Land Use and Neighborhoods Committee will hold a public hearing on a proposal to expand the geographic area of the existing regional Transferrable Development Rights (TDR) Program (also called the Landscape Conservation and Local Infrastructure Program (LCLIP)) to Snohomish and Pierce counties.

Under the regional TDR Program, development rights from farms and forests outside of urban areas (sending areas) may be purchased and transferred to development sites in certain downtown and South Lake Union zones (receiving areas) to achieve additional commercial development capacity. King County allocates a portion of property tax revenue for infrastructure development in receiving areas based on the number of transferable development rights transferred to the receiving area. The program has been operating since 2013.

PUBLIC HEARING

The City Council's Land Use and Neighborhoods Committee will hold a public hearing on the proposal on Wednesday, September 22, 2021 at 9:30 AM.
