LEVY DETAILS

- Passed by voters November 2015
 - 14¢/\$1000 assessed value
 - ~\$65 million annually
 - 6 year levy (Jan 2016- Dec 2021)
- Implementation Plan and budget approved late fall 2016

PREVENTING HOMELESSNESS

YOUTH AND FAMILY HOMELESSNESS PREVENTION

- \$19 million of initial Levy collections intended to “prevent and divert children & youth and their families from becoming homeless.”
- **MODEL**
 - Flexible funding paired with case management
 - Learning circles and training for community providers
- **RESULTS**
 - About 4,200 people were served by YFHPI in 2017
 - 1,100 families with children (4,000 people total)
 - 200 unaccompanied youth and young adults
 - 94% of those served in YFHPI have stayed housed (not entered a program in HMIS)

INVESTING EARLY

PRENATAL - 5 STRATEGIES (50% of levy funds)

- Public Health's parent child health & community health programming
- Home-based services
- Community-based and peer supports for parents
- Developmental promotion, including screening, early intervention services and infant mental health
- Child care health consultation
- Innovation fund
- Help Me Grow



SUSTAINING THE GAIN

SUSTAINING THE GAIN

5 - 24 STRATEGIES (35% of levy funds)

- Partnerships with schools
 - Trauma-informed and restorative practices
 - Screening, Brief Intervention, and Referral to Treatment (SBIRT)
 - Out of school time
 - School-based health centers
- Youth development
 - Mentoring
 - Positive Identity Development
 - Leadership and engagement opportunities
 - Healthy Relationships and Partner Violence Prevention
- Healthy and safe environments
- Parent and community connections
- Stopping the School to Prison Pipeline
