

#### Why is This Grant Happening?

In March 2021, the City of Seattle committed \$1.5 million to address the increase in hate crimes and bias aimed at the Asian American and Pacific Islander community in Seattle. As part of that commitment, the Department of Education and Early Learning (DEEL) is releasing this mini-grant opportunity to fund Youth-Led Social Justice projects that focus on issues of racism, discrimination, and bias and develop innovative strategies to support community and combat hate.

## What is This Funding For?

To provide resources for youth and youthled groups to develop and carry out their own social justice projects that promote anti-bias and antihate related to race, ethnicity, gender, and sexual orientation. These funds are intended to ultimately benefit Seattle's Black, Indigenous, People of Color (BIPOC), especially Asian-American Pacific Islander communities, as well as the LGBTQIA+ community. Projects may serve all Seattleites regardless of age, race, ethnicity, gender, or sexual orientation.


# More Applications than Money?



   the Microsoft Excel budget table is optional
- Three-page maximum, have the pages numbered, and be written in size 11 font or larger; applicants can choose their own font size or write in single- or double-spaced format
- Submitted in Microsoft Word or PDF file format




- Include all required files: (1) Cover sheet (2) Video response to application questions; the Microsoft Excel budget table is optional
- Video must be 90 seconds-to-5 minutes in duration; submission of the Microsoft Excel budget table is optional
- Submitted in MP3 file format and high definition (1280x720, 1920x1080, or higher)
- Use WeTransfer to submit files 10+MB




