Artifacts can provide context to your application submission but will not be scored and do not count towards the page limit.</p> <p>Panel Reviewers (readers) may reference these materials but are not obligated to do so. Therefore, be mindful to strategically provide enough information in the main narrative of the application submission that can reference artifacts you are submitting, and still makes sense (whether or not artifacts are reviewed), while being mindful of your page count. This is a key challenge in grant submissions.</p> <p>Regarding artifacts, artifacts and appendices themselves do not need to be in any specific format, unlike the application submission which DOES have a specific submission format, (see "RFI Submission Template", located at under "APPLICATION FORMS" on the School Based Award: 2020-2021 School Year https://www.seattle.gov/education/for-providers/funding-opportunities/school-based-award-2020-2021-school-year).</p> <p>However, if you are submitting online, you may consider combining all artifacts into one document (PDF or Word), in the order that they make sense for the Panel Reviewer who will be referencing them in the application narrative.
