

Wheelchair Accessible Taxi Request for Proposals





King County and the City of Seattle will award 25 new dual WAT medallions through a request for proposal (RFP) process.

Some key aspects of this RFP are that each awardee:

- Must drive the vehicle herself or himself
- Cannot lease or transfer the medallion for 3 years
- Must put a new (unused) wheelchair accessible vehicle into service (the County and City will contribute a combined total of up to \$5,000 per year toward this expense for up to 5 years)

Requirements

	<p>WAT Certification Proposers must have WAT certification or an equivalent certification and the ability to obtain WAT certification if awarded.</p>	25 Points
	<p>Driving Record Proposers must meet or exceed the at-fault collision and moving violation standards. Points are deducted for each incident in the past 5 years.</p>	150 Points
	<p>Conduct Record Proposers must meet or exceed code violation and passenger complaint standards. Points are deducted for each incident in the past 5 years.</p>	175 Points
	<p>Experience Points are awarded based on the number of years of experience the Proposer has as a taxi, for-hire, or TNC licensed/permitted driver and transporting individuals using mobility devices.</p>	150 Points
