DAN IRELAND, DIRECTOR AND CO-FOUNDER OF SIFF, DIES AT 57

Dan Ireland, co-founder of the Seattle International Film Festival, former acquisitions exec at Vestron Pictures, and film director died in his Los Angeles home April 14 at the age of 57. Ireland began his career at 17 when he co-founded SIFF with Darryl MacDonald, and ran the festival from 1975 to 1986.
