## GUNPOWDER & SKY HAS ACQUIRED WORLDWIDE RIGHTS TO SEATTLE-MADE PROSPECT

Seattle-based filmmakers Zeek Earl and Chris Caldwell's indie sci-fi thriller *Prospect* has been acquired by Gunpowder & Sky. The digital content studio plans to use its acquired worldwide rights to release the film theatrically in the U.S. later this year through its sci-fi label Dust, and screen the film for buyers in Cannes. The film will have its digital premiere on SingularDTV, a blockchain-enabled VOD



platform. Prospect recently had its world premiere at this year's SXSW.
