OTHELLO BLOCK PARTY COMING UP ON JULY 28

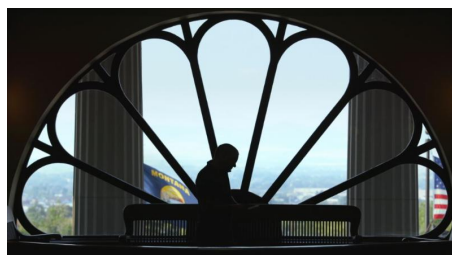
