DESPITE RHETORIC OF DIVERSITY, WOMEN STILL UNDERREPRESENTED IN FILM

A report released by the University of Southern California's Annenberg Inclusion Initiative details an "epidemic of invisibility" still affecting women



in film, particularly women of color, women with disabilities and LGBTQ women, despite recent movements surrounding diversity. "As <u>Time's Up</u> focuses on safety, equity and dignity, we need to be looking to 2019 and 2020 for the major changes where Time's Up exerts its influence and we see a shift in hiring practices for the first time," Dr. Stacy L. Smith, founding director of the Annenberg Inclusion Initiative, said.
