A letter from Director Kate Becker

We are the City of Music, and the next few days offer an incredible example of why Seattle is the City of Music. Pearl Jam's sold out Home Shows will raise millions to help fight homelessness. Sub Pop Records' 30th Anniversary Party on Alki Beach Saturday will draw thousands while highlighting some of the music that put Seattle on the map. More than 80,000 people signed a petition calling for the preservation of the Showbox as a music venue. Right now, our City departments including the Office of Film and Music are working directly with both the Showbox and the developers to reach a resolution that preserves the priorities of the community.

Seattle is not just the City of Music by accident. We are the City of Music because so many of us participate in the act of making music, going to live performances, and digging through record bins. We are not passive consumers of music; we are passionate advocates for music. Musicians and the spaces where we share in their art are vital to the cultural identity of what makes us uniquely Seattle. We must remain vigilant in cultivating Seattle's music economy because when we do, the music economy returns so much more.

Seattle is the City of Music because of all of us. And it will take all of us to make sure the future remains one where music can thrive, where fans can dance, and where all of us can create the kind of community we are proud to call home. I am confident this is possible because together, we are the City of Music.
