SEATTLE CITY COUNCIL VOTES TO PROTECT SHOWBOX

The Seattle City Council voted on Monday to temporarily expand the Pike Place Market Historical District to include the Showbox. Under the measure, the historical district will cover the site of the music hall for 10 months while the City considers long-term ways to save the Showbox, including making the expansion permanent.



SUB POP CELEBRATES 30TH ANNIVERSARY AT ALKI BEACH


