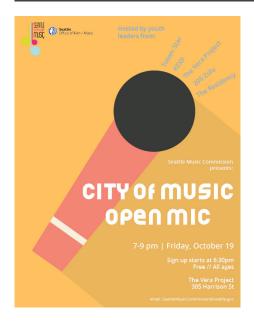


FILM CAREER DAY: FILM BUSINESS AND CREATIVE PANELS ANNOUNCED

WOMEN IN FILM STILL QUESTION OPPORTUNITY POST #METOO

In the year after the rise of #MeToo awareness, women in Hollywood are still processing and evaluating if anything has fundamentally changed in their business - from the nature of scripts to an increase in basic opportunity. Some have noticed a greater interest in more female-focused stories in the past year, while those who work at the script



level have not seen any significant changes beyond male screenwriters writing more female characters.
