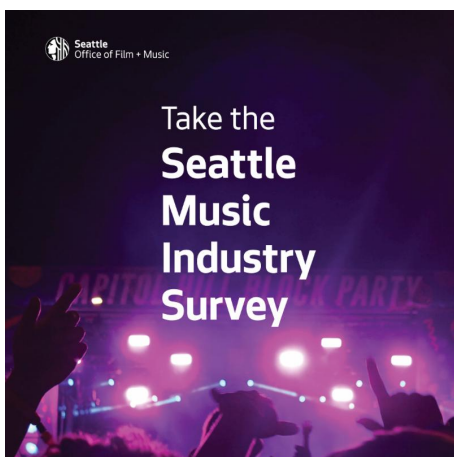

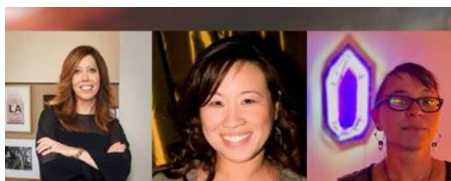


SEATTLE THEATRE GROUP HIRING TWO INTERNS
