Dear,
This letter is a follow-up to your conversation with regarding the possibility of allowing the Seattle Fire Department to use the buildings currently addressed as:
With your approval, we would like to use these building(s) for destructive training. This training can include building construction principles, forcible entry, ventilation, fire attack methods, and firefighter survival techniques.
During the time frame we use the property, we will be responsible for securing the building(s) to prevent illegal entry after each training day. We take responsibility for any injuries to our personne during this training.
The property will be returned to your control on when the Seattle Fire Department Training Division ceases operations at the location. The buildings will be deemed

This training can be discontinued at any time, and for any reason, by order of the Chief of Training. The Seattle Fire Department does not have any obligation to completely demolish any structure. The law also requires that we have the following before we use the building(s) for training purposes:

- Written permission from the owner(s) or legally delegated representative. (Hold Harmless)
- A document proving legal ownership (deed, copy of tax statement, etc.)
- A copy of the certified asbestos survey and proof of asbestos removal for all addresses.
- A copy of the demolition permit.
- Short permission letter that states the following:

unusable once the Fire Department training begins.

- There will be no damage insurance on the training structure(s) as of the date of the first day of training.
- Statement that accepts the criteria noted above regarding the return of the property to your full control.
