At 2:15 Jason Huff, public art manager, will tell us more about the 28 foot tall steel sculpture designed by Stephen Glassman of LA. For pictures and more info about the station check out [this](#) post from March.

Glassman's "Thornton Creek" is a 28-foot-tall, free-standing steel sculpture located in the rain garden of the fire station. The sculpture serves as a rainwater delivery system that moves runoff from the station's roof to an underground. The sculpture includes two raised planting beds that feature and support native Northwest grasses.
