

- Consistently provide the Committee with available data on Navigation Team actions in support of the Committee mission.
- Convey the comprehensiveness of the available data.
- Consider requests for additional sources of information that are not currently available.

Themes

- ▶ Most Data Comes with Caveats
 - ▶ Data collection has changed over time as we've realized the importance of additional data items
 - ▶ We repurpose tools intended for one thing (planning) for others (compliance) without auditing the data for accuracy
 - ▶ Data may come from various sources with different levels of specificity
- ▶ Numbers Only Part of the Story

Overall Contacts




On Aug. 28, 40 professional outreach workers and police officers teamed up to provide collaborative, individualized outreach along the Spokane Street corridor.

- 4667 total contacts
- 1251 unduplicated contacts with individuals
- 463 referrals accepted to safe alternatives
- Data is compiled from a variety of sources
 - Contact-level detail is available for only a portion of contacts
 - Data from February to August 2017

Race and Ethnicity

- Sourced from contact-level data
- In the process of de-duplicating data
- Lots of questions about what to do with data we can't de-duplicate
- First statistics due at the end of September.





Encampment Actions

- ▶ Figures below are from January 1 to mid-August
- ▶ 88 “standard” cleanups under 72-hour notice rules
- ▶ 47 “hazard or obstruction” cleanups not requiring notice
- ▶ Items stored at 89 cleanups
 - ▶ 62 “standard” cleanups
 - ▶ 27 “hazard or obstruction” cleanups
- ▶ Limited information on tents, structures and their contents
 - ▶ How many were observed at cleanup sites
 - ▶ How many were removed or intentionally discarded by their owners

Encampment Actions (cont.)

- Lots of descriptive information that is available for research but not in the nature of usable statistics

Rule Compliance

- ▶ 72-hour Advance Notice
 - ▶ Compliant notice provided in 86 of 88 cleanups
 - ▶ One non-compliant cleanup performed by Parks in February
 - ▶ One case of 48-hour notice
- ▶ Outreach in advance of cleanup
 - ▶ Outreach documented in 87 of 88 cleanups with 72-hour notice
 - ▶ Non-compliant cleanup is the same Parks one
