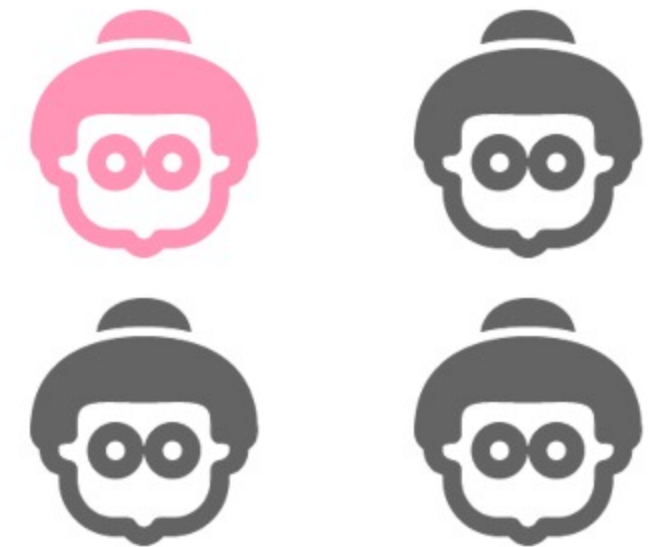
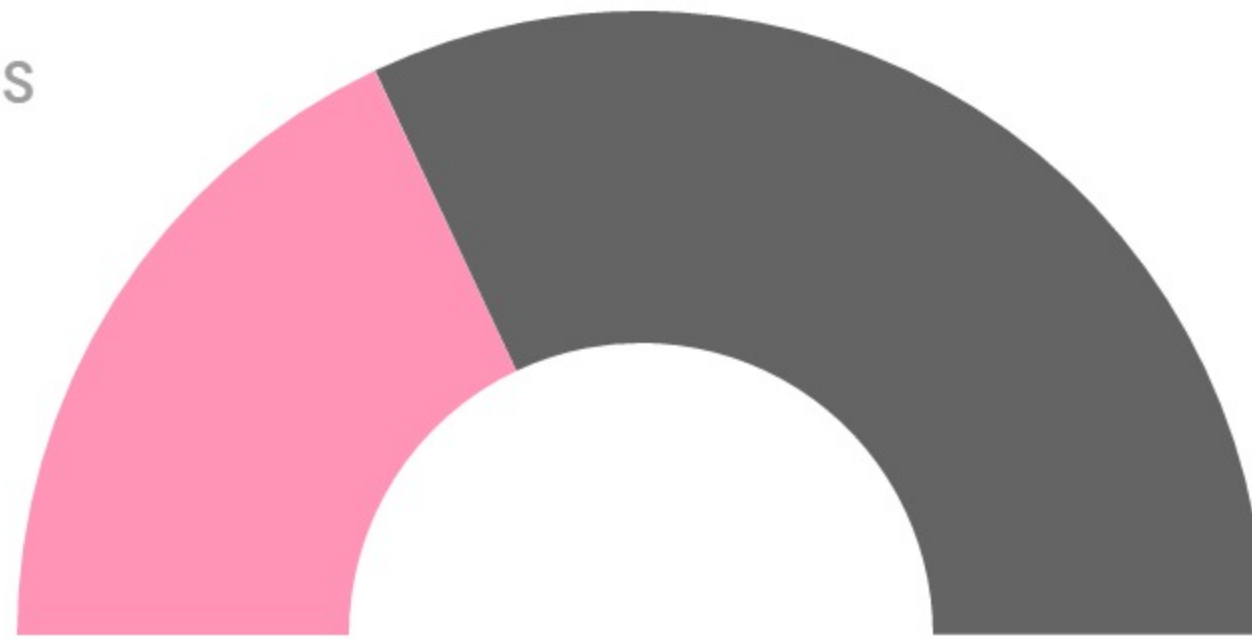

As part of our goal to improve the physical and mental health and well-being of older adults and people with disabilities, Aging and Disability Services in the Seattle Human Services Department has embarked on a number of healthy aging programs, working closely with our community partners. The Human Services Department and the Mayor's Office on Senior Citizens invests \$32.8M in a combination of direct services and investments in agencies that support vulnerable adults.
