The goal of the Duwamish River Opportunity Fund is to benefit the people and businesses along the Duwamish River and improve the quality of life of the neighboring communities.

Successful projects will:

- Address an issue identified in this RFP.
- Be developed through a process that includes community engagement and participation.
- Have clear statements of how the project addresses the community priorities, the anticipated results, and the metrics used to measure success.
- Build linkages among communities and involve a diversity of people and organizations; have engaged project partners across communities, businesses and organizations.
- Be connected to the long-range future of the Duwamish River communities.
- Have a clear budget and demonstrated capacity to manage funds effectively.
