2	ORDINANCE 110347
3	AN ORDINANCE relating to historic preservation, imposing controls upon the Fremont Bridge, a Landmark designated by the Landmarks Preservation Board under Ordinance 106348.
5	WHEREAS, the Landmarks Ordinance (106348) establishes a
6	procedure for the designation and preservation of structures and areas having historical, cultural,
7	architectural, engineering or geographic importance; and
8 9	WHEREAS, the Landmarks Preservation Board after a public hearing on April 2, 1980, voted to approve the nomination of the Fremont Bridge in Seattle as a Landmark under Ordinance 106348; and
10	WHEREAS, after a public hearing on May 21, 1980, the Board voted to approve the designation of the Fremont Bridge
1 1	as a Landmark under Ordinance 106348; and
12	WHEREAS, on August 6, 1980, the Board and the City department with jurisdiction of the designated property agreed to controls and incentives; and
13	WHEREAS, the Board recommends to the City Council approval
14	of the agreed controls and incentives; Now, Therefore,
15	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:
16	Section 1. That the designation by the Landmarks
17	Preservation Board of the Fremont Bridge, more particularly
18	described as Fremont Avenue North over the Lake Washington
19	Ship Canal, as a Landmark based upon satisfaction of the following criteria of Ordinance 106348:
20	(1) It embodies the distinctive visible characteristics of
21	an architectural style, or period, or of a method of
	construction; and
22	(2) Because of its prominence of spatial location, contrasts
23	of siting, age, or scale, it is an easily identifiable
24	visual feature of its neighborhood or the city and
25	contributes to the distinctive quality or identity of
26	such neighborhood or the city;
27	is hereby acknowledged.

Section 2. The following controls upon alteration of the landmark are hereby imposed:

A Certificate of Approval must be obtained or the time for denying a Certificate of Approval must have expired before the owner may make alterations to any part of the entire structure, not including approaches. Any in-kind maintenance and repair for the above noted features shall be excluded from the above controls.

Section 3. The following incentives are hereby made available to the owner:

- The incentives available to all Seattle Landmarks under the City's Zoning Ordinance; and
- 2. Historic Preservation Grants-in-Aid funds, on an application basis, should the property be entered in the National Register of Historic Places.

Section 4. Enforcement of this Ordinance and penalties for its violation shall be as provided in Section 14.08 of Ordinance 106348.

Section 5. The City Clerk is hereby directed to record this ordinance with the King County Director of Records and Elections, deliver two copies to the City Historic Preservation Officer, 400 Yesler Building, and deliver one copy to the Director of the Department of Construction and Land Use.
