1 AN ORDINANCE relating to historic preservation, imposing
2 controls upon McGraw Square (McGraw Place), a Landmark
3 designated by the Landmarks Preservation Board under

6 WHEREAS, the Landmarks Ordinance, Chapter 25.12 of the
7 Seattle Municipal Code, establishes a procedure for
8 the designation and preservation of structures and
9 areas having historical, cultural, architectural,
10 engineering or geographic importance; and

11 WHEREAS, The Landmarks Preservation Board after a public
12 hearing on September 7, 1983 voted to approve the
13 nomination of McGraw Square (McGraw Place) at the
14 intersection of Fifth Avenue, Westlake Avenue and
15 Stewart Streets in Seattle as a Landmark under Code
16 Chapter 25.12; and

17 WHEREAS, after a public hearing on October 5, 1983 the
18 Board voted to approve the designation of McGraw
19 Square (McGraw Place) as a Landmark under SMC Chapter
20 25.12; and

21 WHEREAS, on December 21, 1983 the Board and the owners of
22 the designated property agreed to controls and
23 incentives; and

24 WHEREAS, the Board recommends to the City Council approval
25 of controls and incentives; Now, Therefore,

26 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

27 Section 1. That the designation by the Landmarks
28 Preservation Board of McGraw Square (McGraw Place) more
particularly described as:

the intersection of Fifth Avenue, Westlake Avenue
and Stewart Streets

as a Landmark based upon satisfaction of the following
criteria of Code Section 25.12.350:

2) It is associated in a significant way with the
life of a person important in the history of the
city, state, or nation; and

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- 6) Because of its prominence of spatial location, contrasts of siting, age, or scale, it is an easily identifiable visual feature of its neighborhood or the city and contributes to the distinctive quality or identity of such neighborhood or the city.

is hereby acknowledged.

Section 2. The following controls upon alteration of the Landmark are hereby imposed:

A Certificate of Approval must be obtained or the time for denying a Certificate of Approval must have expired before the owner may make alterations to the entire park site, landscape elements and memorial elements.

Any in-kind maintenance and repair of the above features and characteristics shall be excluded from the Certificate of Approval requirement.

Section 3. The following incentives are hereby noted as potentially available to the owner although the listing shall not be construed as inclusive:

- 1) Section 24.74.020, of the Seattle Municipal Code, entitled Special Exceptions; and SMC Sections 23.44.26; or 23.45.124 Administrative Conditional Uses, certain incentives are available, on an application basis, to authorize, under certain circumstances, uses in a designated Landmark that are not otherwise permitted in the zone in which the Landmark is located.

- 2) Building and Energy Code exceptions on an application basis.

Section 4. Enforcement of this Ordinance and penalties for its violation shall be as provided in Section 25.12.910 of the Seattle Municipal Code.

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Section 5. The City Clerk is hereby directed to record this Ordinance with the King County Director of Records and Elections, deliver two copies to the City Historic Preservation Officer, 400 Yesler Building, and deliver one copy to the Director of the Department of Construction and Land Use.

Section 6. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the City Charter.
