- WHEREAS, after a public hearing on July 18, 1984 the Board voted to approve the designation of Queen Anne High School as a Landmark under Code Chapter 25.12; and
- WHEREAS, on October 17, 1984 the Board and the owners of the designated property agreed to controls and incentives; and
- WHEREAS, the Board recommends to the City Council approval of controls and incentives; Now, Therefore,
- BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the designation by the Landmarks

Preservation Board of Queen Anne High School more particularly described as:

Woodward's Addition, Lots 7 and 8 in Block A together with that portion of vacated alley adjoining, which upon vacation, attached to said property by operation of laws; except the south 20 feet thereof conveyed to the City of Seattle for alley by deed recorded under Recording No. 1576876; and, all of Kellogg's Addition to the City of Seattle, as per plat recorded in Volume 10 of plats, on page 53, records of King County; together with that portion of vacated alley adjoining, which upon vacation, attached to said property by operation of law.

Preliminary Approval

Preliminary Approval for the Queen Anne High School rehabilitation/restoration, per attached drawings, is granted. Board action on final buiding, circulation and landscape plans, and issuance of Certificates of Approval for the proposed work on these structures and the re-use of designated interior features, shall require review and approval by the Landmarks preservation Board.

Additional/Future Changes

A Certificate of Approval, issued by the Landmarks Board pursuant to City Ordinance 106348, must be obtained or the time for denying a Certificate of Approval application must have expired before any changes may be made to any aspect of the designated features of this property that are not in conformance with the above-referenced plans.

In-Kind Maintenance and Repair

1. 244 (144 E.A.)

In-kind maintenance and repairs are excluded from the Certificate of Approval application requirement provided that a Statement of Intent must be filed with the City Historic Preservation Officer prior to commencement of such work.

Section 3. The following incentives are hereby noted as potentially available to the owner although the listing shall not be construed as inclusive:

- 1) Section 24.74.020, of the Seattle Municipal Code entitled Special Exceptions; and SMC Sections 23.44.26; or 23.45.124 Administrative Conditional Uses, certain incentives are available, on an application basis, to athorize, under certain circumstances, uses in a designated Landmark that are not otherwise permitted in the zone in which the Landmark is located.
- 2) Building and Energy Code exceptions on an application basis.

Section 4. Enforcement of this Ordinance and penalties for its violation shall be as provided in Section 25.12.910 of the Seattle Municipal Code.

Section 5. The City Clerk is hereby directed to record this Ordinance with the King County Director of Records and Elections, deliver two copies to the City Historic Preservation Officer, 400 Yesler Building, and deliver one copy to the Director of the Department of Construction and Land Use.

Section 6. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the City Charter.
