Comments: The applicant is right. This play area needs improvement. We are very glad to see this application. Adding structures piecemeal is generally not the best way to improve play spaces. This is because of required fall zones and other codes. Also, when play spaces are designed all at once, there is some continuity.

However, in this case, it is possible to make meaningful changes. We can remove some structures and install play equipment that we know from experience is successful. This can be done partly because the new play equipment will be for small kids and doesn't require as much room as some and partly it is because the equipment that is particularly unused happens to use a lot of space. With some careful maneuvering and design, the play space can be vastly improved.



This project will require one public meeting to select designs prepared by park landscape architect.

Need for Project: This playground is used by preschool kids 4 and 5 years old. The toys are too big for some of the little ones. Also what happened to an old fashioned swing and slide? The climbing structure is becoming worn.The toys that the little ones can fit on are broken or dangerous for them to use. I have seen little ones fall back off of some of the toys. Frankly the toys in the park remind me of an IKEA store not sure where this idea came from. It seems that several city parks have this same style of playground equipment time to replace it. I saw that this was requested last year and was taken off of the list.
