The project would require design, public meetings and park reviews. If there is still interest in that work, the applicant should contact Pamela Kliment at Parks to work on a Neighborhood Matching Fund project.



It is a good idea to repair the portion of the path that is in bad condition; the southwest corner. In addition to supporting the path repair, this funding would allow for repair or replacement of the adjacent benches and updated landscaping. SPR highly recommends this project.
