Levy-Funded Key Strategies

- Targeted small group instructional reading and math support provided in English and Spanish throughout the day and in extended day Math and Literacy tutoring groups
- Extended day Reading interventions provided by certificated staff through the Latino Academy for students and families
- One on one tutoring support with a YMCA-Powerful Schools tutor to improve phonics and phonemic awareness skills
- Tuition support and attendance monitoring for students attending CDSA and YMCA-Powerful Schools classes, with homeless students given a high priority
- Family Support Worker and CDSA staff partner work to identify homeless students, make contact with families, ensure transportation and encourage before/after school care and attendance campaign and intervention strategies for all students
- On-site case worker from El Centro de la Raza supports students in the classroom, oversees the El Centro after school program and meets with families to identify needs and find resources
- Partnership with Odessa Brown to provide family-centered health, mental health, and health care access services, with homeless students given a high priority
- A Spanish speaking Clinical Psychologist and a Nurse Practitioner to work with students on-site to provide mental health counseling, physicals, immunizations, consultations, prescriptions, and more with homeless students given a high priority
