▶ Short-Term Outcome


- Participants will go back to their organizations and begin to delve deeper into their own ELL data

▶ Both current and former ELL academic achievement improves


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

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Identification and Progress Monitoring for English Language Learners

Placement Test

Given to students who indicate that they speak a language other than English at home on the Home Language Survey

▶ Annual Proficiency Exam

Determines amount of growth in English language proficiency and whether student is still eligible to receive services

Both Tests

- Measure students' abilities in <u>reading, writing, listening, and speaking</u> in English
- Identify a level of English proficiency




















ELL Performance Data Federal Performance Seattle Public Schools Measures Performance Measure Three Annual Measurable Achievement Objectives (AMAOs) Measurement of Student Progress (three times a year) Percent of ELLs making English language proficiency gains ▶ Percent of ELLs meeting or exceeding typical growth in the I2 Level I elementary Percent of students who transition out of program schools (~21% of ELLs) Target: 65% of ELLs Actual (Dec.-Feb.): 61% of ELLs Percent of students meeting standard on state's content assessment


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
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

















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
