The 2019 session began on Monday, January 14th. This is a long session, scheduled to go for 105 days, ending on April 28th. Leading up to session, hundreds of bills were prefiled. Combined with the bills introduced throughout the first week, over 700 bills have been introduced so far this session.

The House and Senate held their opening ceremonies on Monday. It was highlighted in the opening ceremonies that the 2019 legislature is the most diverse in state history, including having the first Native American woman (Rep. Debra Lekanoff) and the first refugee (Rep. MyLinh Thai) to serve in the Washington legislature. At the House opening ceremony, Representative Frank Chopp was elected as the House Speaker again for the 2019 session. On Tuesday, Governor Inslee gave the annual State of the State Address. In his address, Governor Inslee laid out his vision for the state and his legislative priorities for 2019. His proposed budget released in mid-December had signaled his top priorities, which include climate change, behavioral health, Southern Resident orca recovery, and education including investments in early learning and opportunities for students after they graduate from high school.

Mayor Durkan attended the Governor's speech, and spent the morning and afternoon in meetings with leaders of both chambers and parties to discuss the City's legislative agenda.

Requires a law enforcement agency to: (1) Comply with certain domestic violence requirements before returning a seized firearm or ammunition to the owner or individual from whom the firearm or ammunition was obtained; and (2) Forward the offense report regarding any incident of domestic violence to the appropriate prosecutor within ten days of making the report. Requires the criminal justice training commission to implement a course of instruction for training law enforcement officers in the handling of domestic violence complaints.
