ACTION

The Design Commission thanked the Crown Hill Elementary Park design team for their presentation and recognized the effort made by the design team to integrate design elements, from the previous presentation to the Commission, into the plan. The Commission unanimously voted 5-0 in favor of the schematic design with the following comments:

- Consider further thought regarding the pathways and their relationship with adjacent uses. Perhaps wider paths and landings near particular areas where uses might require enhanced access.
- Applauds the fence location approach along Holman Rd.
- Pay special attention to doors and entrances of existing building. A 3' wide path might be too narrow for the support and maintenance of the building.
- The Commission commends the use of sculptural art elements, which double as play spaces.
- The Commission encourages further thought into site drainage and the use of vegetation.
- Consider planting trees close to skate dot but without filling it with leaves
- Supportive of the loop path concept vs. the sidewalk incorporation to the park path system.
