Community Climate Project	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• \$10k max• Organizations who received funding the prior year are NOT eligible the subsequent year• General project categories are food, transportation, waste, energy and personal consumption	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Fosters climate-friendly purchasing, transportation or home energy choices• Identifies a clear target audience, objective, and outcomes• Has a clear climate benefit (GHG reduction)• Incorporates a means to measure success• Project is fiscally sound• <i>Other criteria TBD by at Feb 25 Forum</i>	Application deadline is April 22 Awarded projects announced May 15
