CONSTRUCTION NOTICE



February 1, 2017

Opening 31st Ave E to traffic, moving north past the Wilcox Bridge

After weeks of delays due to soils, tree roots, cold weather and rain crews working for Ohno Construction have opened 31st Ave E to vehicles and pedestrians. Work will continue along the entire trail, weather permitting, through the winter. Pedestrians crossing the Wilcox Bridge will encounter trail construction and may experience brief delays where the trail construction crosses existing paths. Earth movement to support trail work will also increase traffic on Foster Island Drive. The Arboretum will remain open during construction. We will route users around the construction activities using notifications and signage for the project duration. We know construction can be difficult and we appreciate your patience as we construct these improvements to the Arboretum.

Traffic impacts

- Construction traffic turning from E Madison St on to Lake Washington Boulevard and along 31st Ave E (location 1 on the map).
- Construction traffic turning on and off Lake Washington Boulevard south and north of the Wilcox Bridge (Location 4 on the map)
- Construction traffic turning on and off of Lake Washington Boulevard from the Birch Parking Lot (location 3 on the map).
- Construction traffic along Foster Island Drive (between 4 and 5 on the Map)

Upcoming construction activities

- Signage will continue to update pedestrians on access routes, **PLEASE USE DESIGNATED ACCESS POINTS AND EXISTING CROSSWALKS WHEN CROSSING LAKE WASHINGTON BOULEVARD.**

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- Typical work hours from 7 AM to 5 PM on weekdays
- Increased construction traffic on Lake Washington Boulevard
- Parking limitations along 31st Ave E (location 1 on map at right)
- Closure of the Birch Lot to parking (location 3 on map at right)
- Pedestrian traffic routing around construction
