# EXTREME RISK PROTECTION ORDERS (ERPO)

### **Extreme Risk Protection Orders**

Extreme Risk Protection Orders (ERPO) prevent individuals at high risk of harming themselves or others from accessing firearms by allowing family, household members, and police to obtain a court order when there is demonstrated evidence that the person poses a significant danger.

#### How can I request an ERPO?

Email **ERPO@kingcounty.gov** where advocates and staff are available during business hours Monday-Friday to provide assistance, including referring callers to the appropriate law enforcement agency.

## Extreme Risk Protection Order Served in West Seattle, Firearms Recovered

Family members of a 91-year-old man with dementia contacted police last month expressing concern about him after he began threatening to shoot anyone that came to his home. The family members knew he had firearms in the house and were very concerned that he might harm himself or others.

A Crisis Response Unit officer took the lead and petitioned the King County Superior Court for an Extreme Risk Protection Order (ERPO). The order was granted. The order was served last week and the man voluntarily turned over eighteen firearms from inside his West Seattle home. The firearms were submitted into evidence for safekeeping.
