Mission: to deliver a transportation system that provides safe and affordable access to places and opportunities



Background of Modal Integration Framework

- Advancing modal plans to understand:
 - Available information on right-of-way widths
 - Full understanding of what modal facilities and functions might compete for constrained space in the right-of-way
 - A holistic view of how to move people and goods



Goal: solve an internal process issue

• To make predictable decisions for specific street segments where right-of-way is insufficient to build all planned modal networks to standard dimensions



Modal integration framework: bike network

- Intention to elevate the importance of prioritizing all ages and abilities (AAA) bicycle facilities in these areas
 - Update the Complete Streets Process that is used by staff to guide project development decisions
 - Review the 7% of arterial street segments with constrained curb-tocurb and create a map where bike infrastructure would be prioritized because there are no viable alternative routes
 - Other 90%+ of arterials would use BMP recommendations and the typical complete streets analysis process



Advancing bicycle facilities


 Prioritizing bike facilities in constrained right-of-way is only once piece of the puzzle



2014 BMP map


Timeline and next steps

Seattle transportation plan
