

# BLOCK PARTY OR PLAY STREET PERMIT

## Frequently Asked Questions NEIGHBORS

### **CAN I ACCESS MY HOUSE DURING A BLOCK PARTY OR PLAY STREET?**

Yes, local access is always allowed. The host is responsible to ensure an adult is available at all times to quickly move the barricades allowing access for local traffic. This includes visitors, deliveries, and emergency vehicles.

### **WHAT SHOULD I DO IF I HAVE AN ISSUE WITH A BLOCK PARTY OR PLAY STREET ON MY BLOCK?**

Occasionally, SDOT staff receives complaints about Block Parties and Play Streets. Normally, these are related to proper access not provided. For this or other reasons, we encourage you to have an open dialogue with your neighbors to resolve issues directly. If this has not resolved the issue, please send detailed complaints with photos to [Publicspace@Seattle.gov](mailto:Publicspace@Seattle.gov) and your complaint will be assigned to an inspector.

### **CAN I PARK MY CAR ON THE STREET DURING A BLOCK PARTY OR PLAY STREET?**

Yes, parking is not restricted unless the “no parking” a-frames are present 72 hours in advance.
