
Background

 - Keep buses moving




Project area

2020 lane layout changes




Rainier and Rose - today

- Left turns are the problem



Rainier and Rose - improvements this year





Rainier and Rose - improvements *next* year

- Extend sidewalk on southeast corner
- Remove seating area and add parking
- Change lane layout

Date	Activity
Spring 2019	 Ask project neighbors for their feedback (stop by our table)

2020	 Likely remove seating area by Rose St Triangle Make it easier to walk across both Rainier and Rose Change lane layout
