1. Regular Business

- SWAC Co-Chair, Nico Onoda-McGuire called the meeting to order at 5:35 PM.
- Members and guests introduced themselves. Prompted by the SWAC chair, they each shared their name and new hobbies they have picked up during the "Stay-home" order.
- Two new SWAC Members were introduced: Lizzie Szorad Works for Recology and lives in the Greenlake area
- Kit Gardner learned about SWAC several years ago in college. Works as a paralegal in Seattle
- Holly provided an update on her time spent on Sweden and the challenges they face with solid waste

2. Solid Waste LOB Updates

SWLOB COVID Program Updates

- The city of Seattle will follow the governor's orders and staff that can work from home, will work from home.
- Transfer station is closed 3 days a week and only open for essential visits
- King Co. will check addresses and Seattle residents will no longer be able to use their transfer stations
- Hazardous Waste facilities in the North and South were both closed due to staffing issues. Looking into reopening temporarily
- Offering rate relief for select customers.

SWLOB Customer Messaging Updates

- We have asked customers to ensure their cart lids can close.
- Spring Clean programs have been suspended. These will not be reopened until we receive direction from the Mayor's Office
- Seattle's nuisance code has been suspended
- Plastic bag usage has gone up as many retail companies are not allowing customers to bring in their own bags from home
- A SWAC member asked, "Are there impacts of the closure of the West Seattle Bridge to collection?"
- An SPU member responded Yes, it has affected routes that drivers use. But other impacts have not been documented yet due to primary focus being on Covid-19

Stephanie Schwenger was introduced as the newly hired Solid & Hazardous Waste Lead Planner

3. Legislative Updates

Sego provided status updates of some of the current bills.

- Seven bills passed the legislative, and seven did not. Several partial vetoes and full vetoes were submitted. Some bills that were vetoed have a fiscal impact not related to Covid-19.
- **A SWAC member** asked, "With the number of bills that were vetoed, how many do you anticipate cycling through again?"
- **An SPU member** shared there could be a special session that focuses on financial impact of Covid-19. It is tough to gage how many will be cycled through again.
