
Madison Corridor BRT Overview



Madison BRT Background

2012 Transit Master Plan

- Identified 5 priority corridors based on:
 - Ridership
 - Travel time savings
- City-wide analysis
 - Concept for corridor limits and type of service



Project need and goals

- Make transit faster and more reliable
- Make the transit rider experience better with more comfortable stops and faster boarding
- Enhance pedestrian connections
- Develop an alternate bike route
- Advance streetscape and public spaces

Current phase: Project Definition Study

- Statement of project purpose and need
- Develop and analyze two corridor design concepts
- 10% design, engineering, and cost estimates
- Develop implementation strategy and identify elements for early application


Study outcomes

Develop a transit design concept that:

- Has community and elected official support
- Is backed by a viable phasing and implementation plan
- Positions the City for future funding opportunities to help design and build the project




Study approach and timeline



Scope – Bicycle Task

- Complete Streets Directs SDOT to design streets for pedestrians, bicyclists, transit riders, and persons of all abilities, while promoting safe operation for all users, including freight.
- Develop an alternate bicycle route from the waterfront to Martin Luther King Jr. Way that provides a safe and reliable connection.



Bike Route Segments

- Alaskan Way to 9th Ave Seneca/Spring Protected Bike Lane (BMP), Center City Bicycle Network project
- 9th Ave to Broadway University Street Greenway (BMP)
- Broadway to MLK 2 route options
 - Denny, 21st, Thomas, 24th
 - Union, 27th, Arthur Place
