Seattle Freight Advisory Board Seeks New Members

The City of Seattle supports the effective and safe movement of goods and services. Seattle Department of Transportation (SDOT) is assisting the Seattle Freight Advisory Board (FAB) with expanding its membership. Please feel free to express your interest or to provide this notice to individuals or businesses that you think may be interested in serving on the FAB.

Board Purpose - The Board advises the Mayor, the City Council, and all departments and offices of the city in the development of a functional and efficient freight system, and on all matters related to freight and the impact that actions by the city may have on the freight environment.

Board History - The Board was created by Seattle City Council Resolution 31243 in 2010.

Board Composition - The Board is composed of 12 regular members - six appointed by the Mayor, five appointed by the Council and one designated by the Port of Seattle. The 11 appointed members are subject to Council confirmation. Membership term is two years. Members can serve two terms.

Meetings – Board meets on the third Tuesday of each month from 9:30 to 11:30 in City Hall's Boards and Commissions room.

We are seeking members who represent:

- Different means of transporting goods and services by truck, rail and marine modes
- Different geographic areas of the city: citywide, and the Duwamish and Ballard Interbay Northend Manufacturing and Industrial Centers
- Businesses and organizations that depend on the efficient movement of freight
