Project goals

- Faster and more frequent bus service
- Improved access to transit
- Improved safety for those walking, biking, driving, and riding the bus





Project background

- 4 mile corridor
- 235 driveways
- At least 5 foot sidewalks on both sides of the street throughout the corridor
- Bike lanes and sharrows
- Unrestricted on-street parking and no parking
- 6,300 daily bus boardings; Route 120 is one of the busiest and most productive routes in the city
- Average Daily Traffic declined about 10% since 2009



Fall 2018

Previous community outreach - what we've heard

Fix potholes and bad pavement

We're planning to pave between the West Seattle Bridge and Sylvan Way SW and to make minor repairs in the rest of the corridor

Make buses faster and more frequent

We're adding bus only lanes and bus signals to keep buses on time and out of traffic







Reduce speeding and create a neighborhood feel

We're adding about 2 miles of landscaped median islands and new public art





We value the bus as a neighborhood connector

We've worked with Metro to have RapidRide stations about 1/3 mile apart instead of 1/2 mile apart

We want safer and more accessible options for people biking

We've added a southbound protected bike lane and are making new connections to adjacent neighborhood greenways

Street channelization details (10% Design)


SW Andover St to SW Graham St

- Southbound protected bike lane (parking removed)



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



Street channelization details (10% Design)

- Peak bus lanes, off peak parking
- Southbound protected bike lane (parking removed)







TYPICAL EXISTING

Current challenges for people walking

- Not all intersections have ADA-compliant curb ramps
- Obstructions to sidewalks (utility poles, driveways)
- Skewed intersections
- Few marked crossings
- High speed, high volume arterial
- Steep, disconnected east-west street grid
- Improving connections and crossings was a community priority




Pedestrian details (10% Design)

- New pedestrian lighting














SW Oregon St (10% Design)






SW Hudson St (10% Design)








SW Orchard St (10% Design)






Sylvan Way SW (10% Design)




