


100 Resilient Cities Network



































NORTH AMERICAN RESILIENCE STRATEGIES

- Leveraged almost \$8M worth of services from 100RC partners (across entire NA portfolio)










RESILIENT SEATTLE LEADS WITH RACE

For every \$100 earned by white families, black families earn \$57.30.


...And for every \$100 in wealth held by white families, black families have \$5.04.




Seattle had a net gain of nearly **21,000** people — **57 a day**

Homelessness

4,505 homeless people were documented outside in Seattle and surrounding areas




