How to pay

You can use the card on the bus, light rail, ferry, and commuter rail anywhere in King, Pierce, or Snohomish Counties. (Note: Fares may exceed \$1.25. Add cash to your card accordingly)

If you live more than 2 miles awav

You will receive a free ORCA Card with a pass worth any \$1.25 (youth) fare. Tap it on the scanner when you get on the bus.

Don't damage or loose your card. Your first replacement will cost \$5, your second will cost \$25

If you live less than 2 miles away

Seattle Public Schools will not pay for your commute. To purchase a youth Orca Card and fill it with cash/a pass, go in person to a retail outlet during office hours. (The closest location to Garfield High School is the Westlake Tunnel Station)

Live in north Queen Anne?

Route 13 runs every 30 minutes, every 15 minutes peak, from SPU to downtown via Queen Anne Ave. Most trips on route 13 become route 2. (Route 2 frequencies are half as much north Galer st.)
