City of Seattle YOUTH ORCA PROGRAM

Want an ORCA card?

If you are not eligible for an ORCA card from Seattle Public Schools, you may be eligible for the City of Seattle's new Youth ORCA program.

The ORCA cards distributed through this program will be valid for the entire school year, September 2016 through June 2017. Income eligibility for this program is consistent with many other programs including: SNAP, Free and Reduced Lunch, and ORCA LIFT. ORCA cards are valid on King County Metro, King County Water Taxi, Seattle Streetcar, Sound Transit, Community Transit, Pierce Transit, Kitsap Transit, and Everett Transit.

HOW TO SIGN UP

To receive an ORCA card under this program, a student will need to fill out the application and get a parent or legal guardian's signature.

WHERE TO SIGN UP

The front office of each school will be the distribution point for ORCA cards. Students should submit a completed application to the front office of their school.

- Missing/lost cards: Program participants are expected to notify staff in the front office of their school if they misplace or lose their ORCA card. A fee of \$5.50 will be charged for the first card replacement. A fee of \$25 will be charged for any subsequent replacements.
