The <u>Seattle</u>-Urban Forestry Commission (UFC) stands with Black Lives Matter. <u>We-The UFC</u> condemn<u>s</u> the murders of George Floyd, Rayshard Brooks, Breonna Taylor and many other Black Americans at the hands of police. <u>We-The UFC</u> acknowledge<u>s</u> that this systemic racial violence also lives within our own city. <u>We-The UFC</u> honor<u>s</u> their lives and demand<u>s</u> an end to the killing of unarmed Black civilians by police.

<u>As an entity-advisory body toof the City of Seattle, we the UFC acknowledges we it isare</u> occupying the traditional land of the Duwamish and Coast Salish people. The current system of lawmaking in Seattle including Council and the Mayor is created through a white normative process which amplifies white voices and minimizes voices of Black, Indigenous and People of <u>Color (BIPOC)</u>. The U<u>FCrban Forestry Commission</u> is a part of this process, we and is committed to identifying manifestations of white supremacy and seeking greater equity within the <u>CommissionUFC</u>. We The UFC will utilize the Racial Equity Toolkit, foster intentional dialogue amongst Commission members, and welcome public comment to guide our its work.

Furthermore, the<u>is Commission-UFC</u> recognizes our<u>its</u> direct responsibility to mitigate environmental racism in Seattle. People of color are more likely to live near polluters or breathe polluted air. Thus, particulate air pollution has adverse impacts on health outcomes in communities of color. As climate change progresses, we will see the most severe impacts will affect in already marginalized communities. Additionally, 2016 The Seattle Tree Canopy Assessment confirmed found that "census tracts where the population tends to be residents of color and people with lower than average income also have lower amounts of tree canopy." the less white a neighborhood, the less likely it is to have robust tree coverage", (Tipayosthi, Davidow).-Trees are a tool of environmental protection and public health. The U<u>FCrban Forestry</u> Commission pledges to seek support out-policiesy and programs-that remedy tree canopy discrepancies for recommendation to Mayor and Council.
